TENSION IN THE SYSTEM: RECAPPING THE ALL-CHURCH MEETING

I have one of those garden hoses that is advertised as unable to get kinks in it, and it works pretty well. However, occasionally, while it doesn't kink like older hoses, it still binds up and restricts the water flow. Then, when I give the hose a little tug, it releases some of the tension and the water flows freely.

In my Spire articles this summer, I've sought to emphasize the ways in which just the right amount tension can be a good thing using the following images: jumping rope, Hamilton's call for Aaron Burr to live more fully into his convictions in the musical Hamilton, and water skiing. Then, in our "Thriving Faith" videos each Wednesday on the church's Facebook page, we've shared ways in which our United Methodist tradition helps us live in response to God's grace in our everyday lives.

But, as with my garden hose, sometimes stretching helps us find the necessary tension to allow for full, thriving, faithful living in community. My hope is that our recent church informational meeting provided a little of this sort of unbinding. While I cannot condense all of that conversation, we have prepared a recap video and some additional resources that can be found on the church website. In what follows, I will attempt an alternate, more condensed recap in Q&A format

In the spirit of unbinding the hose, please also see the video, and talk with me or Pastor Seungli if you have other questions or concerns.

Is the United Methodist Church splitting? No. A group of United Methodists have officially launched a new denomination (the Global Methodist Church, on May 1) for two simplified reasons: 1) a desire to make sure their churches continue to forbid same-sex marriages and the ordination of self-avowed and practicing homosexual people; 2) a series of critiques about the polity or organization of the UMC.



Presently, a very small percentage of local UM churches (and two clergy) in our annual conference have chosen to stop being United Methodist. Other denominational affiliation for these churches has not been publicized. Finally, the departure of some churches does not require any action from Kearney First UMC, other than to continue growing in its God-giving mission.

Is the United Methodist Church, moving forward, abandoning orthodoxy, changing its historical Christian doctrines, and being overtaken by liberals/progressives? No. The next General Conference, in 2024, is the only body to speak for the church, and it's not presently clear what legislation will come before that body, or how it will act.

However, it is effectively impossible to change our historical doctrines – such as the Incarnation, the Trinity, the primacy of scripture, etc. In this regard, the United Methodist Church generally, and Kearney First UMC locally, will continue to hold fast to all of our historical doctrines, seeking to live into Christ's calling to make disciples of all nations through which God is transforming the world.

Because we're a denomination founded on helping people experience and respond to God's grace - as opposed to denominations formed by rules and retribution, dogma, or doctrinal debates - we'll continue to be a denomination based foremost on the commitment to live out our faith in response to God's grace. This means we'll continue to be a diverse, bigtent sort of community: a connection with space for George Bush and Hillary Clinton (both UMC members), for the mission-minded justice advocates and the prayer and Bible study groups, for the hand wavers and pew-seated nodders. Perhaps this is harder than being homogenous, but our unity has never been about uniformity. Instead, we've always sought to live in response to grace that makes space for faithful, thinking disciples of Jesus to disagree and still be part of God's mission in the world together. God's grace looks like this: the fullness of God's presence living and walking with us in Jesus, who consistently invited people to follow him in his way of putting love of God and love of neighbor first in thought and practice. Grace isn't forceful; it's

So, what's next for Kearney First United Methodist Church? Transparency leads me to say we have two options. First, we can spend most of the next year in an undoubtedly divisive journey toward leaving the denomination, driven largely by unfounded fears and half-truths. Or, second, we can spend the next year, and each after that, seeking to clarify and enact God's particular calling and vision for us as Kearney First UMC, so that, by the Holy Spirit's sanctifying grace, we can grow as a people who love God, love others, and make disciples through the practices of talking to God, listening to God, partnering with God, growing in God's image, and sharing God's grace with others. To me, only the second option sounds like Jesus' calling.

EAST LAWN FOOD PANTRY



Visitors at the food pantry have stayed rather consistent with 330 families visiting in June furnishing food for some 1300 individuals. Repeat visits to the pantry indicated 804 visits. This is about 90 visits each time the pantry is open. So the volunteers serving at the pantry are very busy each time.

We are still experiencing some shortages of food items that are no longer from the Food for the Heartland out of Omaha. Thankfully, Cashway Distribution has filled the void with many meat and other key food items for East Lawn. But, keep the pantry in mind and when you shop, buy one item for the pantry and if several people do that, it will help us out greatly. The main item we are short in in canned fruit. It is rather expensive as compared to other items but still furnishes a healthy food for clients. Look for sales in the local grocery stores and help support them as they are having some supply issues as well.

Thank You to all those volunteers who pick food items up from the grocery stores in Kearney and transport it to the trailer, to volunteers that sort the food items and place it on the shelves, to volunteers that work each day the pantry, to those that work on those days repacking items or other large packaged items into smaller packages for distribution. There are over 50 people who help in one way or another to support the pantry outreach program. That sounds like a lot of people, but if several are gone and some are only able to tackle certain jobs, it sometimes becomes hard to find people to work. So if you would like to be put on a substitute list, that would be great! If you would like to help with one of these or more areas, please contact Colleen Jacobsen for scheduling a time to help. 
